

## Strong hit for Wedgetail

**WEDGETAIL Exploration has had early success in its bid to upgrade the resource at the Barton project in Western Australia, recording a standout intercept of 6 metres grading 38.12 grams per tonne of gold from 45m.**

The Barton project is located around 25 kilometres from the Golden Eagle project and has an inferred resource of 1.23 million tonnes grading 2.56 grams per tonne of gold.

Barton and Golden Eagle (part of the Nullagine gold project), are currently subject to a feasibility study to expand the resource and improve the confidence category of the inferred resource to measured and indicated.

Recent drilling at Golden Eagle has also proved successful for Wedgetail, extending the resource to the west of the current pit line. The western end of Golden Eagle is considered to be highly prospective for surface mineralisation by the company.

Golden Eagle currently has a resource of 359,000 ounces.

An RC program designed to investigate the strike orientation at the Linq deposit has returned intercepts of 6m grading 2.54gpt gold from 44m and 3m grading 10.93gpt gold from 64m. Mineralisation is now interpreted to strike east northeast.

Meantime, Wedgetail has started an infill and extensional drill campaign at the All Nations deposit, which will be followed by definition drilling at the Little Wonder, Shearers and the recently delineated Linq and Barton South prospects.
